ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Nonprofit Corporation

The undersigned natural person(s) of the age of 19 years or more, acting as incorporator(s) of a corporation under the Alaska Statutes (AS 10.20) hereby executes the following document and sets forth:

Article 1. Name of the Corporation: The name of a corporation may not contain a word or phrase that indicates or implies that it is organized for a purpose other than one or more of the purposes contained in the articles of incorporation of the corporation.

Article 4. Provisions, not inconsistent with law, which the incorporators elect to set out in the articles of incorporation for the regulation of the internal affairs of the corporation, including provision for distribution of assets on dissolution or final liquidation:

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section 2 hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income

- a. The purpose of this organization shall be the advancement and education of religion and elimination of prejudice and discrimination based on religious beliefs, specifically those religions that fall under the definition of "Pagan" as defined for this document. The organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. This corporation is a religious corporation.
- b. For the purposes of this document, the words Pagan and Neo-Pagan may be used interchangeably, and are defined as follows. A Pagan or Neo-Pagan is someone who self-identifies as a Pagan, and whose spiritual or religious practice or belief fits into one or more of the following categories:
 - Honoring, revering, or worshipping a Deity or Deities found in pre-Christian, classical, aboriginal, or tribal mythology; and/or
 - Practicing religion or spirituality based upon shamanism, shamanic, or magickal practices; and/or
 - Creating new religion based on past Pagan religions and/or futuristic views of society, community, and/or ecology; and/or
 - Focusing religious or spiritual attention primarily on the Divine Feminine.

Distribution of earnings

- a. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section 2 hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Pagan Pride helps members across the country organize local events in honor of Pagan Pride Day and the Autumn Equinox, including but not limited to public religious ceremonies, picnics, parades, festivals, networking events, public education through media or publications, and food drives or other charitable donation drives. Other activities may be included depending on the wishes of the local organizers; members shall not in any substantive manner engage in activities that are illegal or that are not in furtherance with the stated purpose of the organization.
